Scholarship details

The scholarship is renewable each year for four years as long as you remain in good academic standing. The scholarship is merit-based, but creating a highly diverse and inclusive Marquette community is a priority. A limited number of housing scholarships are available as well. For students who do not receive housing scholarships, federal Pell Grant eligible students are eligible for the Urban Scholars Award. Added consideration will be given to applicants who have participated in academic or college preparatory pre-college programs sponsored by Marquette University.

You should apply as a high school senior and note the following qualifications:

- Applicants should have a GPA of at least 3.0 in a high school preparatory curriculum.
- Students should demonstrate a history of leadership and service in and out of school.
- Preference will be given to students who demonstrate financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid or Net Price Calculator.
- Preference will be given to first-generation college students and Milwaukee residents.
- Students who identify as Black, African-American, or of African descent are encouraged to apply.
